	<b>6.1</b>	<b>There is a clear treatment model applied consistently across the Therapeutic Community</b>
1	6.1.1	The treatment model is clearly understood by all <i>community members</i>
2	6.1.2	The treatment model is shared with all Governance Partners such as commissioners, external multidisciplinary teams, executive boards etc.
1	6.1.3	The treatment programme is designed into at least three main stages: induction, primary treatment and leaving
1	6.1.4	Each stage of the treatment programme has clearly defined written goals, activities and expectations
2	6.1.5	Completion of each stage of the treatment programme is celebrated as a rite of passage
2	6.1.6	The treatment program includes an encounter/conflict group

1	6.1.7	Community members are encouraged to apply a simple element of CBT: to think and act as if they have progressed as a means of developing a positive attitude
1	6.1.8	There are clearly defined sanctions with a rationale and process for allocating them e.g. Status advancement, more desirable living space
1	6.1.9	Service users agree to be subject to sanctions for infractions of rules that may involve the loss of status or privileges
1	6.1.10	Sanctions for violations of rules are well defined, and known by all community members
1	6.1.11	Service users are given the opportunity for input regarding behavioural sanctions to be imposed by staff
1	6.1.12	The community protects service users from public humiliation or physical punishment
1	6.1.13	There is a hierarchical structure of community members which establishes levels of responsibility and status by job function
1	6.1.14	Senior service users take a responsible role in relation to junior service users
2	6.1.15	The staff team includes a proportion of graduates from a TC

1	6.1.16	The community maintains a drug-free environment, with the exception of prescribed drugs
1	6.1.17	Staff do not use or support the use of illicit substances
2	6.1.18	Service users contact with individuals outside the TC is limited and closely monitored by the community
1	6.1.19	The community offers relapse prevention training
1	6.1.20	Service users are advised on the risks associated with relapse when leaving the community
1	6.1.21	Ex-service users are welcomed back to the TC after leaving, to an event that celebrates their drug-free life
