Accessing Expertise

Get to know your membership benefits

Thanks to your feedback, it has come to the international team's attention, that many members may not be aware of the breadth of resources available to them as part of their College membership benefits.



One of the standout features of our <u>library services</u> is the **Literature Searching Service**. Members can simply submit their query, and our library team will conduct a thorough search across multiple academic databases to gather high-quality information tailored to their needs. Past topics have included ketamine-assisted psychotherapy to critical discussions on societal issues such as racism in psychiatry. Additionally, members can delve into topics such as trauma and psychosis, mindfulness therapy, and even the intersection of financial debt and mental health. In addition to literature searches, our library services extend to inter-library loans, allowing members to request articles beyond our collection. While there are limitations on the number of requests per person per week, this service broadens the scope of accessible information.

Members can access **databases** like Medline, PsycINFO, and Embase, or utilise our own Library Catalogue to conduct their literature searches. An <u>e-learning module</u> is also available to walk you through the steps, and our dedicated library staff are always on hand to assist with any queries. Accessing these resources is made simple through our partnership with **OpenAthens**. For those who haven't yet registered, obtaining an account is as easy as sending <u>an email</u> to our library team. Once registered, you'll have access to over 40,000 eBooks and all College journals.

The <u>BJPsych Journals app</u> is another exclusive benefit for all RCPsych members and aims to bring the latest issues and digital content directly to you on the go. Access a comprehensive collection of five journals, including the latest 12 months' issues, along with search capability, offline content saving, and integrated podcasts and videos, while receiving notifications for new releases.

President Lade Smith's Visit to MHAT



In a special visit, during the 2024 ANCIPS conference in Kochi, India, President Smith had the privilege of exploring the work of the Mental Health Action Trust (MHAT) in Kerala, founded by Dr Manoj Kumar, RCPsych South Asian Division Chair. MHAT has an exemplary model of care, delivering comprehensive and recovery oriented mental health services to the most vulnerable segments of society. Operating solely within the community, MHAT's innovative approach does not rely on hos-

pital admissions and allows patients to remain in their homes or localities while receiving treatment.

What sets MHAT apart is its collaborative ethos, partnering with like-minded local entities to extend its services free of charge to those in need. Through the concept of task sharing, MHAT optimises its resources, with seasoned psychiatrists overseeing critical care components while delegating other responsibilities to trained professionals, as well as mental health workers. Furthermore, the organisation has widened its scope to address the social determinants of mental ill health, assisting clients in accessing essential

services such as pensions and facilitating citizenship registration.

Located just one hour outside of Kochi, President Smith had the opportunity to visit one of MHAT's remote clinics. Situated within a cooperative bank, this innovative clinic not only offers stigma-free mental health services but also serves as a vital community hub, empowering local farmers to secure fair prices for their produce. During her visit, President Smith had the opportunity to meet with the local branch director, who emphasised the significance of the partnership with MHAT for the local community, particularly for individuals

grappling with a lack of access to quality services.



Special thanks to MHAT team, especially Dr Manoj Kumar, Dr Meena Srikumari and Ms Sona Narayanan for their time and care during our visit.


International diploma in Older Adults' Mental Health

The international team is delighted to announce the launch of the College's first <u>International Diploma in Older Adults' Mental Health.</u>

This new knowledge enhancement programme is designed for doctors outside the UK wishing to upskill or refresh their understanding of how the most common mental disorders in older adults present and are managed.

The programme will allow learners to broaden their understanding of the clinical and service-related complexities of working within older adults' mental health. In addition, learners will contribute to an international community of practice for psychiatry of older people, providing the skills and knowledge to develop services for older people within their own clinical practice.


RCPsych book: Volunteering in Global Mental

The European Division recently hosted a highly successful Dean's Grand Rounds webinar titled Catatonia and ECT: a European perspective. This webinar focused on a case of severe catatonia in an intensive care unit, highlighting the rapid and complete response to ECT, while also incorporating the service user's views. The goal of the webinar was to provide delegates with an overview of the awareness and knowledge of catatonia among European psychiatrists, review the literature on ECT as a treatment for psychiatric conditions including catatonia, and discuss current attitudes towards ECT.
